








## What's the story and what's the reality?

"I'm scared to go out alone at the moment. I share my location with my family and they check in on me."

"I can't know why a particular person is carrying the flag, so I shouldn't assume the worst. I wish we could reclaim the meaning of the flag as something which unifies us. That would take away the power from right wing people."

"I asked my husband what we would do if a particular party wins at the next elections. It's scary to know that both government and society can turn against me. It's scary to think I can be physically or verbally attacked, or laws changed and I wouldn't feel safe here anymore."

"I haven't really seen any England flags around here, but a few months ago, there was a rumour that there was going to be a protest at the Mosque. In the end, no-one came apart from the police, and non-Muslim local people to help."

"They are as much prisoners of the organisations as the hostages. It is a life commitment - you can never get out of it. Once you're in, all your dreams are circumscribed to the organisation."













